<p><u>Grammar Focus</u> Pupils will identify verbs, nouns, adjectives, pronouns and adverbs within sentences. They will add suffixes and prefixes to given words and gain a deeper understanding of sentence types and their structures.</p>	<p><u>Famous for more than Five minutes</u> Pupils will study individuals who have made a significant contribution to society both nationally and internationally. They will analyse the lives of Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Martin Luther King.</p>	<p><u>Animals including humans</u> Pupils will investigate how animals have offspring which grow into adults. They will find out about and investigate the basic needs of animals for survival. Pupils will also be able to describe the importance for humans to exercise, eat the right amounts of different types of foods and undertake hygienic practices.</p>	<p><u>Parables</u> Pupils will discuss the messages and lessons Jesus taught through a selection of parables. Parables studied include the Good Samaritan, the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin, the Great Feast, the talents and the Two Builders.</p>	<p>Pupils will estimate and count a number of objects up to 100. They will compare pairs of numbers and find a number in between. Pupils will order three numbers and 2 digit numbers. They will revise number bonds to 10 and begin to learn the related subtraction facts. Pupils will double numbers to 30, use patterns in numbers bonds and use number bonds to solve more difficult equations. They will sort 2D shapes according to symmetry, identify right angles and investigate tessellation. Pupils will begin to mark numbers on a landmarked line, compare and order numbers using &lt; and &gt; and work systematically to find all possible inequalities.</p>

<p><u>Dance</u> Pupils will explore basic body actions and use different parts of their body to make movements. They will create and debug simple programs and use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of some simple programs.</p>	<p><u>Self Portraits</u> Pupils will compare famous self-portraits from a variety of different artists. They will develop the skills of observation and recording through drawing in a variety of media. Pupils will experiment with different techniques to create their own self portrait.</p>
